DRINKING WATER WARNING – BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Date Of Notice: March 7, 2019

Date of Boil Water Advisory: March 12, 2019

Due to waterline work in the King Street area, we need to shut the water off on **March 12, 2019 from 10:00 am – 5:00 pm**, weather permitting. The following streets will be affected: King Street from Brookside Avenue to Stokes Mill Road, Willow, Monroe, Race Streets and Madison Avenue, as well as the Buttonwood Trailer Park.

With a loss of water pressure, this creates conditions that *could* allow contamination to enter the water distribution system. With repairs finished, ***there will be a “boil advisory” in effect*** until further notice.

What should you do as a water customer?

WE RECOMMEND THAT YOU DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST – until further notice. A boil water advisory means that any water used for consumptive purposes (drinking, making ice, washing dishes, brushing teeth, or cooking) should be brought to a rolling boil, let it boil for (1) one minute, then let it cool before using. You can also use bottled water temporarily.

This is a precautionary measure required by PA DEP regulations. Inadequately treated water may contain disease-causing organisms, including bacteria, viruses, and parasites, which can cause symptoms such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea, and associated headaches. These symptoms, however, can also be caused by other factors. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice.

People with severely compromised immune systems, infants, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from EPA’s Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1-800-426-4791.

Once water service is restored, and tests are done on the water, the Borough will distribute a notice that all corrective actions have been completed and advise you when there is no longer a need for the water boil advisory. When the water is turned back on, it is possible the water may be cloudy and “stirred up” for a while after resumption of service; this should clear shortly.
