

**PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE  
AND REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR THE FY 2019  
COUNTY OF MONROE AND ON BEHALF OF EAST STROUDSBURG AND STROUDSBURG BOROUGH  
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM**

Notice is hereby given by the County of Monroe and on behalf of East Stroudsburg and Stroudsburg Borough that it will hold Public hearings on:

The purpose of the Public Hearing is to discuss the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program in general, the needs of the County and on behalf of East Stroudsburg and Stroudsburg Boroughs, and the County of Monroe and on behalf of East Stroudsburg and Stroudsburg Boroughs performance under the previously funded CDBG Program years and to discuss the required Three-Year Community Development Plan of all three entitlements.

The County of Monroe and on behalf of East Stroudsburg and Stroudsburg Boroughs are expected to receive an allocation of approximately \$ 641,613 of FY 2019 CDBG funds from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

- County of Monroe - \$ 399,581
- Borough of East Stroudsburg - \$ 149,057
- Borough of Stroudsburg - \$ 106,042

At least 70% of the available funding must be used for activities which benefit low and moderate income persons in the service area to qualify as a low-moderate income project. The proposed activities must benefit at least 51% low-moderate income persons in the service area. The Pa Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) has not announced the application submission deadline date but is expected to be Fall 2019. Early planning is necessary for this process.

The following types of activities may be eligible for funding under the CDBG Program: water and sewer line replacement and improvements; housing rehabilitation; construction of affordable housing; construction/reconstruction of public/community facilities; recreational facilities; public services that are new or provide quantifiable increases in the delivery of services; street improvements; historic preservation; removal of architectural barriers; code enforcement; economic development; acquisition and relocation; clearance and demolition; and general administration.

If the County of Monroe and on behalf of East Stroudsburg and Stroudsburg Borough would undertake activities that result in the displacement of families or individuals, then the County of Monroe's policy for minimizing such displacement would be in effect. The County of Monroe and East Stroudsburg and Stroudsburg Borough is responsible for replacing all low and moderate income housing units that may be demolished or converted as a result of the use of CDBG funds.

The County of Monroe and on behalf of East Stroudsburg and Stroudsburg Boroughs do not discriminate in regards to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, familial status, ancestry, disability, age, and the use of guide or support animals because of blindness, deafness or physical handicap of the user or because the user is a handler or trainer of support or guide animals in the provision admission, employment or access to the County's service programs.

All interested citizens are encouraged to attend and will be offered the opportunity to give oral testimony at the public hearing and/or to present written comments concerning the needs of the County of Monroe and on behalf of the East Stroudsburg and Stroudsburg boroughs, proposed CDBG program activities, the prior use of CDBG funds, as well as the CDBG Program in general. Written comments will be received for 15 days beginning July 17, 2019. Project applications and/or comments may be directed to Martha Robbins, CDBG Administrator at (570) 421-4300. Applications will be due by 4:00p.m. July 26, 2019.
